Please make every effort to arrive at campus for arrival or dismissal within the time window for your child's program. Queuing in the driveway early can block traffic for others and cause elevated driveway stress. If you arrive early, please park in a space off the driveways and wait for your time window to queue.

Please make every effort to arrive on time so that your child has the optimum experience at school. Morning arrival in the classroom is an important social experience for your child. It offers them the opportunity to greet the teacher and their friends and to learn about plans for the day ahead. Children who arrive late often feel disoriented because their teachers and peers are already actively engaged in lessons.


